• If you follow the news, you know there has been a lot of discussion around changing COVID-19 vaccine recommendations. KPHD made a <u>blog post</u> with a few key points to be aware of as we enter the fall season.

- Wash. Department of Commerce is soliciting applications for \$70M in affordable
 housing projects for the creation of new housing units, purchase and rehabilitation
 of new housing units, affordability subsidies, and down payment assistance for lowincome households in Washington. Review the Notice of Funding Availability and
 apply by Sept. 26 at 3 p.m.
- DOH Healthy Environment for All (HEAL) Community Capacity Grants are available
 for community organizations to equip communities most impacted by
 environmental hazards to collaborate with state agencies on environmental justice
 decisions. Learn more and apply by Sept. 30 at 11:59 p.m.
- Better Health Together is providing funding for the community-based care coordination work of 10-20 community-based organization partners that employ community-based workers. <u>Learn more and apply by Sept. 30.</u>
- Robert Wood Johnson Foundation is accepting applications for Reinvesting in Racial and Indigenous Health Equity Research. This is funding exclusively available to applicants who have already received federal funding (e.g., from the NIH, CDC, NSF) for their health equity research but have since had their funding partially or fully rescinded due to federal administrative actions. <u>Learn more and apply by Oct. 1 at</u> 12 p.m.
- The downtown Seattle library branch has access to the <u>Foundation Directory</u>, an extensive database of nonprofit grants to locate prospective funders. You can <u>schedule appointments</u> with a librarian trained to help you with nonprofit information and research, including helping navigate the Foundation Directory, conducting planning and proposal research, finding free resources for building nonprofit skills, and connecting with local experts. You qualify to get a <u>Seattle Public Library Card</u>, which is needed to access these services, if you have a Kitsap Library Card and any document that verifies your address.
- Health in Partnership is accepting applications for its <u>Power-Building Partnerships</u> for Health (PPH) 2026 cohort. This year-long program brings together government health agencies and CPBOs in existing partnerships to strengthen their collaboration, advance health justice, and grow their collective. Selected participants receive \$25,000 in flexible funding for community power building.
