





Formed in 2022, the Kitsap Health Equity Collaborative (HEC) brings together public health professionals, healthcare partners, and community leaders to bring systemic change in our county.

The Health Equity Collaborative's activities are named in <u>Health Board Resolution 2021-01</u>, <u>Declaring Racism a Public Health Crisis:</u>
"The Board and the Kitsap Public Health District commit to work to advance a public health approach in addressing institutional and systemic racism, including [...] partnering with community to co-create solutions to address structural inequities."

The Health Equity Collaborative meets every other month and has named three priority greats to focus collective action ground:
